



WORLD CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP, SAN LUIS (ARGENTINA), 27.9-16.10.2005



Chess makes kids smarter! We've all heard that one before... So many times. Why? Because it's true!

How about adults? Yes! **Chess makes adults smarter, too, make no doubt about it!**

I am about to check out performances of eight chess geniuses, gathered in San Luis, Argentina, challenging their wits, striving for a dream come true - becoming World Chess Champion 2005!

One need not be a genius to recognize ones competing in San Luis. And I recognize all eight of them!

It's Sunday, October 02, 2005. A free day at the World Chess Championship. **Free day?** It is probably the most hard-working day for all! Preparations often last morning until midnight. If not for the players, for the trainers surely. For chess professionals, there is really no free day at all. One day away from chess may put one a week behind others.

It's my free day, too. Well, I decided to spend it as a chess player/trainer should – with chess! Not that difficult to do, as this is the game I love.

Four rounds have ended until today. Below is the current cross table, generated by the World's 8th miracle – ChessBase 9.

I will now have to travel a bit through time, only a few days back, to restore memories. You will notice my unorthodox approach, with all game move time details included. It will make it so much easier to understand the games, and hopefully often offer much more than a standard professional analysis. I have chosen randomly one game to present, the first one from the game database downloaded from the FIDE website. The diagrams are large, so you can recall important positions easier! My intention will not be to compete with the analysis, that will be thoroughly made by the players themselves, but to point out some instructive (critical) positions to remember, with special comments related to time management, an important area in chess, still unexplored!



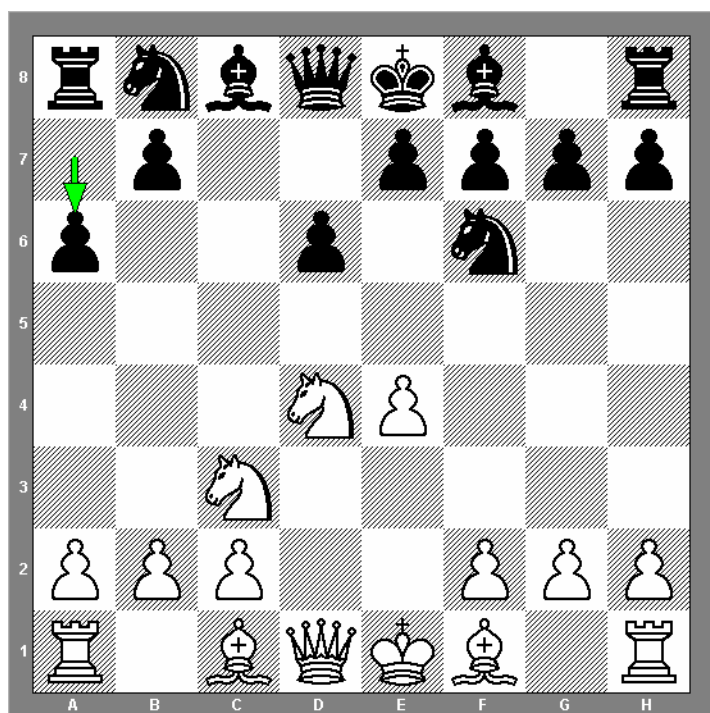

Too slow! Having in mind the 30 second bonus increment. An experienced player/trainer can predict a time troubled game even after these 5 moves only.

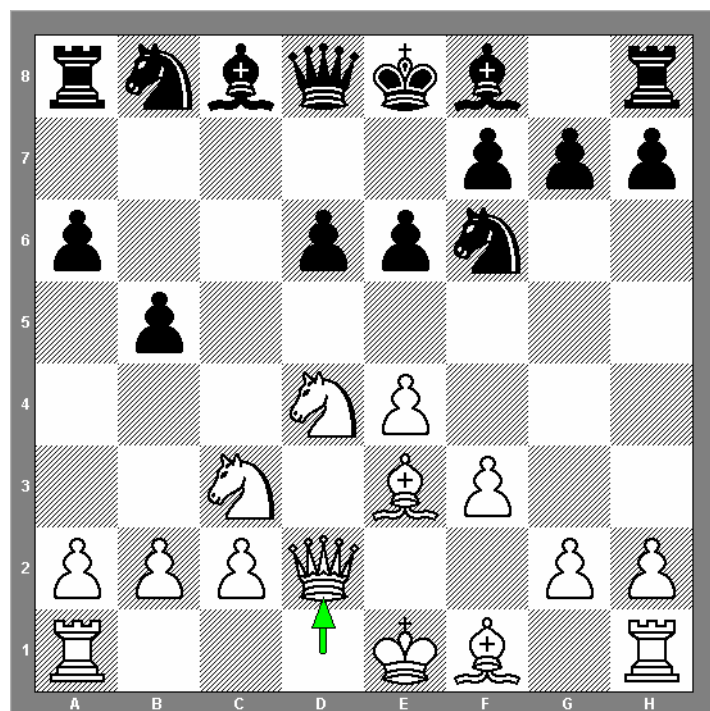

World's 9th miracle - Chess Assistant, regards this continuation as one with which White cannot hope to keep his minimal starting advantage. Preference is given to 6.Bg5! or 6.f4!

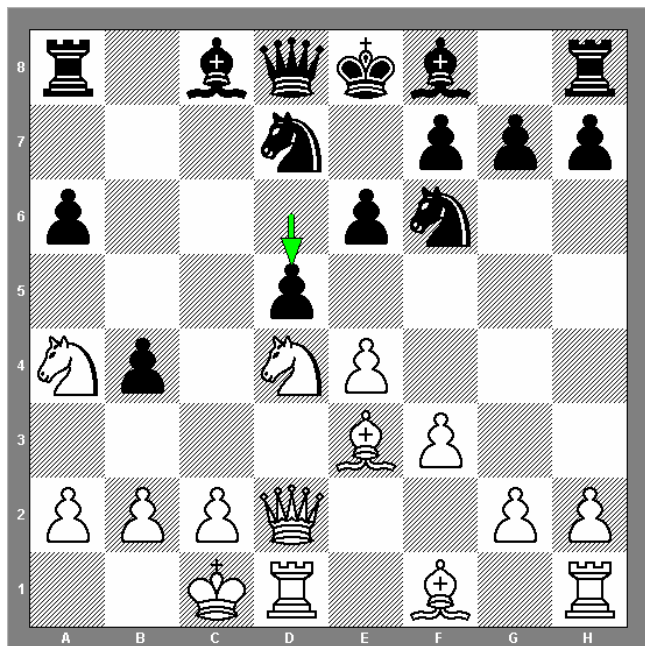
Much is still unknown in theory. Topalov's choice has been played only a few times, compared to the popular 8...Nbd7! and 8...Bb7! The correct order of moves for both sides is obviously still "under construction".

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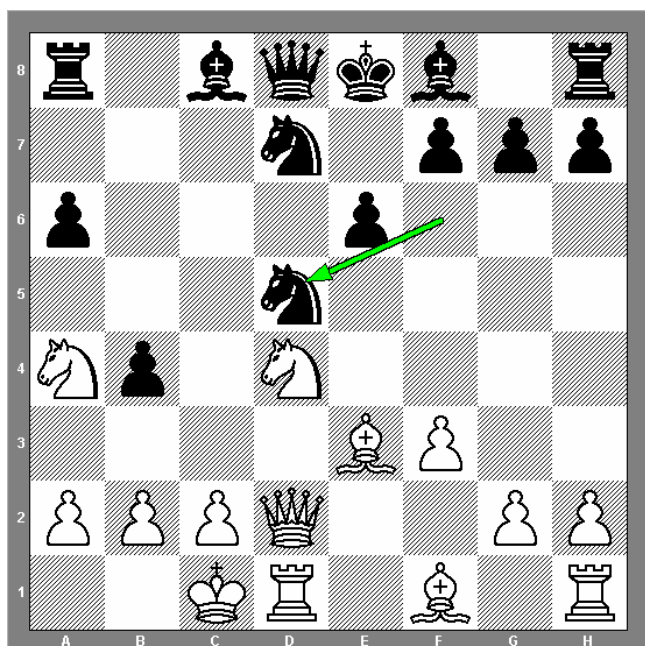

As all can see from the time record, a choice made quickly by the Hungarian World Chess Champion candidate. When having a development advantage, try to open the position! Leko is trying...

Excellent! Develop, develop and develop! ... These are the three most important rules for the opening phase of the game.

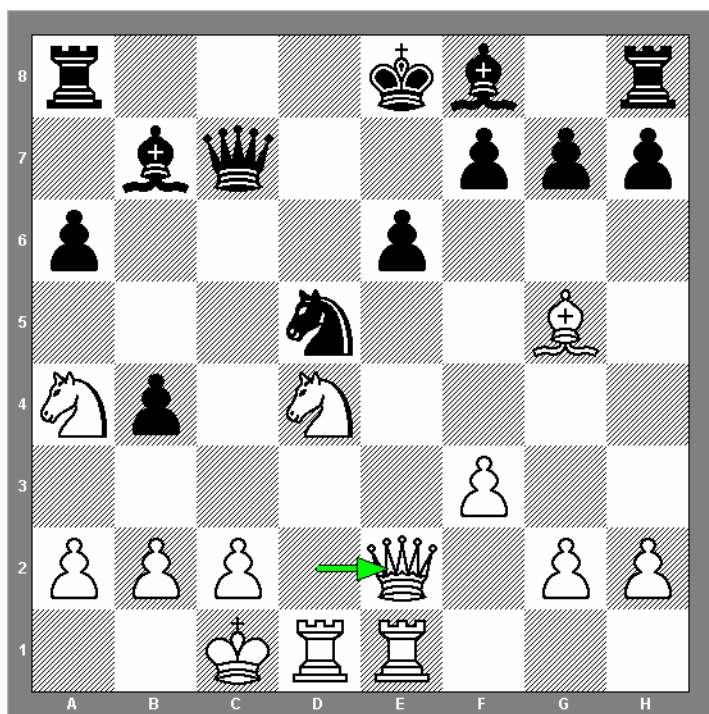
Another round of applause is necessary here. And - some criticism as well. It took Leko 18 minutes for this decision, a bit too long for a super-power in chess. Time trouble is not that far away.

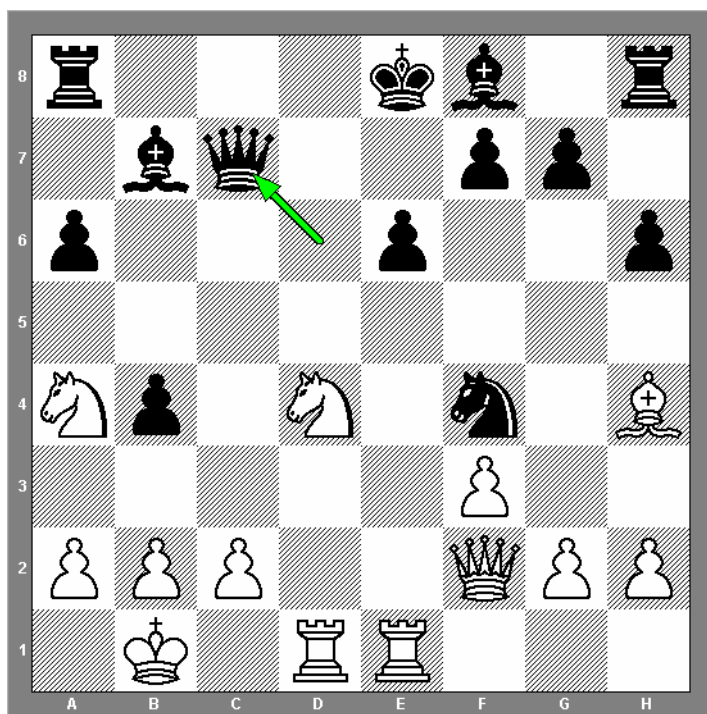

The question mark is not for the move played, but for the time spent on it. 40 minutes? Simply too much.

I think I don't need repeating myself. 35 minutes gone. Was it worth it? The 30 seconds bonus time received (for free) after each move played, is hardly an excuse for such precious waste of time.

20.Nb6!! would have thrown Topalov into even more severe time trouble. The Knight is untouchable and joins the attack on the Black King fast enough. But, how to find such a move with only 16 minutes left to complete the first time control? Too much time spent by both players up to here is the only reason the game starts to lose it's quality rapidly. The players might disagree here, as I might - from a players point of view, but the trainers will agree, I am sure!

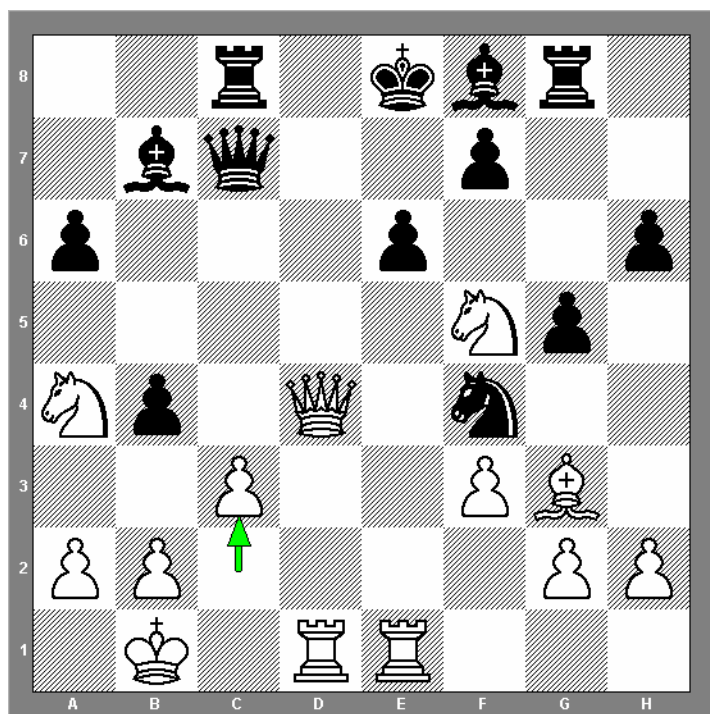

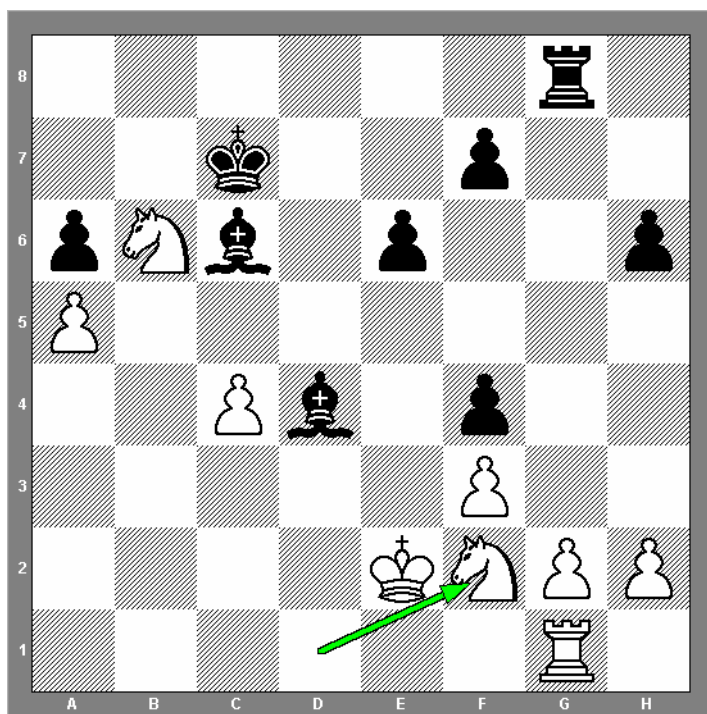
